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Continuous Medicaid Coverage is Ending

Do you or someone you know have Medicaid? Indiana Medicaid provides health insurance for low-income children, adults, seniors, expectant mothers, and individuals with disabilities. Medicaid covers one in three Hoosiers—more than two million individuals in Indiana. Everyone with Medicaid will need to renew their coverage. This did not happen the last three years for Hoosiers with the Healthy Indiana Plan (HIP), Hoosier Healthwise, Hoosier Care Connect, Children's Health Insurance Program, Medicare Savings Program, and traditional Medicaid.

Anyone covered by Indiana Medicaid should ensure the Indiana Family and Social Services Administration (FSSA) has their correct address. They can update their information on the benefits portal by visiting https://fssabenefits.in.gov or by calling 800-403-0864. It's very important that they open and respond to all mail from FSSA and their health plan (Anthem, CareSource, MDwise, MHS, or United Healthcare).

Healthcare insurance can be confusing, but free, unbiased help is available from Indiana Certified Navigators. CAPWI's Healthcare Navigator, Elaina Smith, serves Benton, Fountain, Montgomery, Parke, Vermillion, and Warren Counties and can be reached at:

Fountain/Warren Head Start to Grow Community Garden

CAPWI's Fountain/Warren Head Start is honored to announce the Rooted Hearts Community Garden in Covington. The garden is part of the Scotts Miracle-Gro Foundation and the National Head Start Association's GroMoreGood Garden Grants initiative, which seeks to connect one million Head Start children across the country to garden education and fresh food.

Fountain/Warren Head Start received a GroMoreGood garden grant to build raised garden beds for planting fruits and vegetables that will be distributed to their enrolled families. Once the project is complete, they will invite families to help them plant and take care of the garden. This will be a special time when families can bond. It will also provide many learning opportunities along the way.

According to Jessica Gaudry, Head Start Center Manager, "We are honored to receive grant support for our garden. We hope it will improve the lives of the Head Start children and families we serve.



"The research is clear: garden-based learning improves educational outcomes, enhances social and emotional learning, and—perhaps most importantly—engages every child's innate wonder and care for the natural world," said NHSA Executive Director Yasmina Vinci. Free Lift Program Offered by MAC Van

MAC Van received a grant and is now involved in the Free Lift Program. Eligible individuals are under the court's supervision with an assigned probation officer. The program covers the Fountain and Warren County areas and was designed to provide transportation to individuals to court appointed appointments, classes, visitation, etc. at no cost to them. "I see how in need they are, and I am so glad I get to participate and help them. It is very rewarding to help someone who is in dire need," said Tammy Nickle, MAC Van Coordinator.

The Family Development Program

The Family Development Program is a new program that focuses on housing stability and is available to any Indiana renter. The program provides support and resources to actively move families towards their vision of housing stability and self-sufficiency. Families will complete an intake assessment with their family development case worker and will be scored on a matrix that covers 12 life areas. The goal

of the program is to improve the family's matrix scores on as many life areas as possible and improve their housing stability. The families are encouraged to set and achieve short-term and long-term goals while also meeting with their case worker once a month to track their progress. Counties we serve include: Benton, Fountain, Warren, Vermillion, Parke, and Montgomery Counties.

Our Highland Manor Senior Units underwent some exciting updates to its community room. Angela Golia, CAPWI Property Manager, filled us in on how the idea came about:



Most of our Tenants at that property do not have a lot of family or visitors, so I feel it is important to help foster a community mindset there.

During my several visits to the property, I noticed that their library/social space was in dire need of an update and cleanout. I put an email out to all CAPWI staff asking for donations of their gently used books, puzzles, and games. I received several boxes full of books! I spent an afternoon there moving furniture, clearing out old books, and trying to make the space more functional for our Tenants. I also created a puzzle, game, and adult coloring area in the room. While I was there, I had a few Tenants stop in to chat with me and express their appreciation. It was very rewarding to know that my little gesture would possibly bring some joy to them.

My plan there is ongoing. I will be removing the old microwave and replacing it with a donated one. I am also accepting donations of home décor to brighten and freshen the space. Robin and I are reaching out regarding classes or programs that the Tenants would be interested in, as well as possible transportation options."
